A LETTER FROM KYLE RIFE DIRECTOR OF MOOSEHEART ADMISSIONS

I am currently serving as the Director of Mooseheart Admissions and would like to ask for your help. I have included a letter that you will hopefully agree to share with members of your respective Lodge/Chapter. In my time here serving in admissions I have found that referrals from members and admissions representatives, as opposed to other sources, are much more likely to result in a child being placed at Mooseheart. I believe that the personal commitment and concern that Moose members bring to the process is helpful in establishing trust and confidence with the families that we serve.

These discussions may also lead to new members as your acquaintances see the service that our fraternity provides its children. Consider a recent story involving an 82 year-old grandmother who after providing 10 years of daily care for her 4 grandchildren admits that she is sometimes too tired to cook dinner. Her children were accepted to Mooseheart last month and she is enjoying new membership in the WOTM. Although each situation is unique, Mooseheart considers any child in need of a stable and loving home.

I recently watched Mooseheart's second and third grade children perform a medley of American patriotic songs. After the children performed for a room full of students and Mooseheart staff they smiled as they enjoyed a thunderous applause that led them to sing an encore of "She'll be comin' around the mountain."

As I saw their little faces light up it reminded me from where they had come. Some from neglect or abuse, some from a loving grandparent who just couldn't give anymore, some from a home where mom worked three jobs but had no time to parent because dad disappeared. But that wonderful day they weren't thinking of any of those challenging days of the past. That day they were singing. That day they were smiling as a room full of people applauded for them. That day they were happy and loved.

Without the members of the Moose that day wouldn't have happened. Thank you Loyal Order of Moose. If each member will send just 5 letters we will tell millions about Mooseheart! Let us get the word out and share the gift of opportunity; let us share the gift of Mooseheart.
