I personally want to thank Curt and Bonnie Wolf, as they do one heck of a job with the Kids Club.

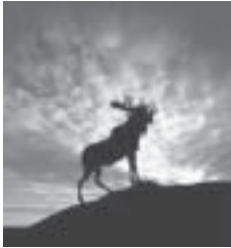
Do not forget all the things that are coming up at our Lodge. If you take time to read the newsletter, it is all in there.
