MOOSE NEWS

MOOSEHEART, IL, March 9, 2004 - Donald Ross, Director General and Chief Executive Officer of Moose International, today announced the fraternal organization's first-ever Vice Presidents of Business Operations and Fraternal Operations, respectively.

Beginning Monday, March 15, **Thomas P. Conway** will become Moose International's Vice President/Business Operations, with direct supervision over the departments of Finance, Claims & Loss Prevention; Information Systems; Human Resources; Purchasing and Administrative Services. Then on Monday, March 22, **Kurt T. Wiebe** will become Vice President/Fraternal Operations, with direct supervision over the departments of Membership; Women of the Moose; General Governor; Supreme Secretary; Community Service; Fraternal Education; Moose Legion; Publications; Government Relations; Family Activities; and Ritual & Sports.

Conway, 43, comes to Moose International from the Schaumburg, IL-based American Academy of Dermatology Association, a 14,000-member medical specialty society which he had served as Executive Director since 2000. There, he directed a staff of 125 and led efforts in strategic planning, policy development, human resources, technology and applications, fundraising and investment management. Prior to going to the AADA in 1996, Conway had been Vice President/Treasurer for 10 years with the National Futures Association. Conway holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from Illinois State University and is a

certified public accountant; he received a master's degree in business administration from Loyola University in Chicago in 1991. He is married and is the father of three children; the Conways reside in Glen Ellyn, IL.

Wiebe, also 43, comes to Moose International from the Oak Brook, IL-based Illinois Manufacturers' Association, a trade association representing nearly 4,000 manufacturing firms, which he had served as Vice President/Marketing & Communications since 2000. At IMA, Wiebe developed marketing initiatives, membership campaigns, and government-relations programs, as well as overseeing all IMA publications, newsletters and electronic media. Wiebe served from 1994-2000 as Vice President/Communications for Chicago-based Metals Service Center Institute; from 1992-94 as Director of Communications for the Illinois-based Automotive Service Industry Association; and from 1985-92 as Director/Creative Services and Exhibits Marketing Coordinator for the Chicago-based National Association of Realtors. Wiebe holds a bachelor's degree in marketing and communications from Ball State University in Muncie, IN. He is married and the father of three children; the Wiebes reside in St. Charles, IL.

Both Conway and Wiebe will report to Director General Ross; also continuing to report to Ross will be Moose Charities Vice President/Chief Operating Officer Kurt J. Wolbrink, Mooseheart Director Scott D. Hart, Moosehaven Director Faye Stevens, and General Counsel Leonard J. Solfa Jr.
