BAD CHECKS

Sometimes we go for months without seeing a "Bad Check" and then we get hit for three or four the next month. Our policy on "Bad Checks" is this: We will call you if we have a good phone number. If you do not pay in a reasonable period of time, we will send you a Certified Letter and if the check is still not paid after 10 days of receipt of the certified letter, we take the check to the District Justice for further collection efforts and added costs. Our cost at the Moose is only \$25.00 plus the amount of the check. But if we have to go to the District Justice, it is going to cost you a lot more.
